

I view conservatorship as an extreme last resort, not a substitute for real services. I'm wary of expanding it while we have ongoing sweeps that push people block to block without a genuine offer of shelter, housing, treatment, or case management. The city should engage encampments with sustained outreach and real choices, not performative displacement.

San Francisco has had a legal mandate for "treatment on demand" since Prop T passed in 2008, but it still hasn't been delivered. I'd only support conservatorship once every alternative has genuinely been exhausted, with strict due process, independent judicial review, and an actual bed and discharge plan attached.
